# Introduction

A total of 850 Questionnaires were distributed during March 2013 and 154 containing data were returned, this gives a return rate of 18%. The survey was also available on line and there were 46 submissions containing valid data. Each paper Questionnaire was designed to accommodate the answers from one to six individual respondents. The combined returned Questionnaires contained the answers from 344 individual respondents

The Questionnaire contained 28 subject based questions separated into 11 sections. 11 of the questions requested free text and these are omitted from this analysis as they are contained in a separate report. The 21 questions in this report consist of 82 individual question rows.

There were two options available for filling out the questionnaire; by the online software SurveyMonkey or the paper version distributed to all households in the village. It was difficult to get the data from both sources into a standardised format but this was eventually achieved and after thorough testing the data was validated.

The SurveyMonkey online report showed 52 entries but the downloaded data contained 6 entries with no data entered apart from the post code so these were deleted leaving 46 valid entries. The post codes entered all related to a location in Swavesey

The number of entries via SurveyMonkey was relatively low possible owing to an error in the published URL resulting in an invalid certificate warning which would have resulted in some people not completing the survey. The corrected URL was published on the Village Website. It was also found that only one entry per PC could be made so only one entry per household was possible where cookies were enabled on the PC.

This report shows the data for each of the 28 non free text question subjects with the total answers for each of the 82 questions and the percentage compared to the total 344 responders.

The analysis of each question also has a single row table at the bottom giving the total individual respondents answering at least one or more question rows and the percentage compared with the total 344 respondents..

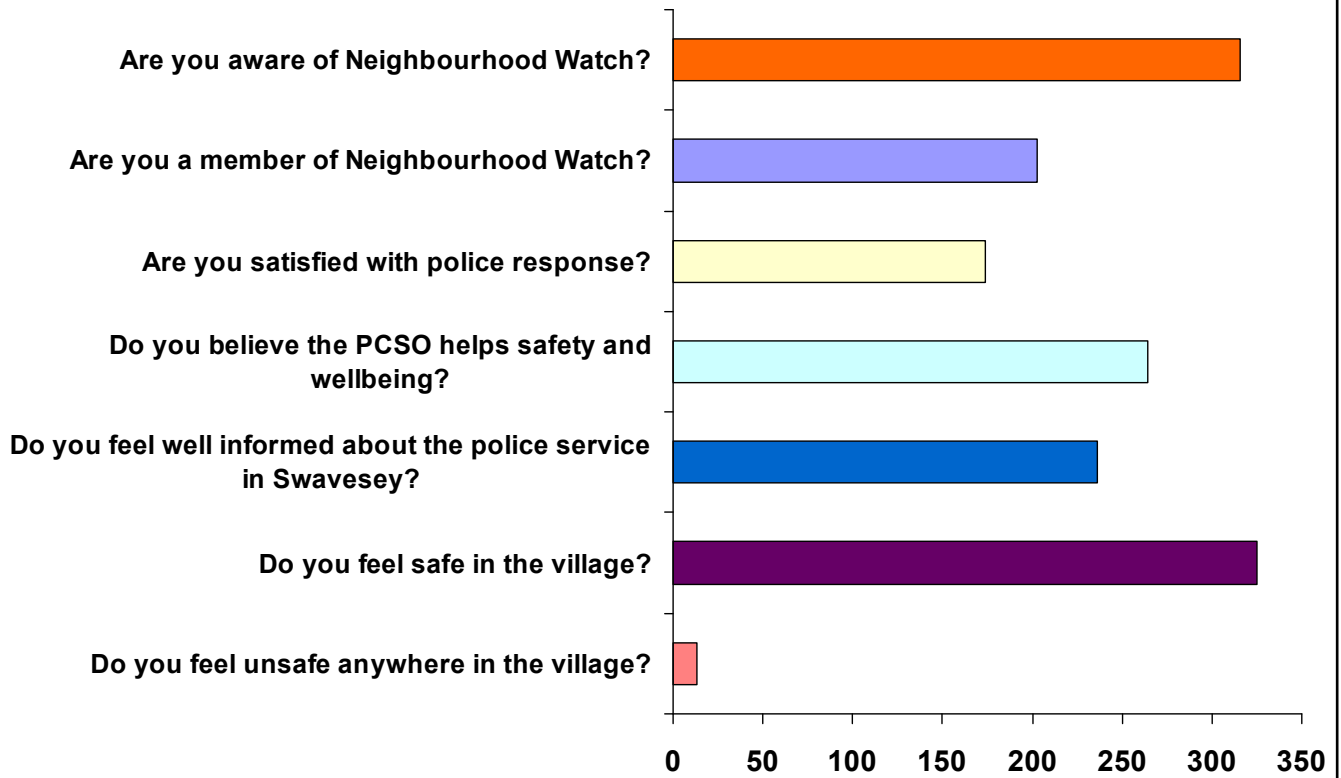

## Q2: Questions relating to safety in the village



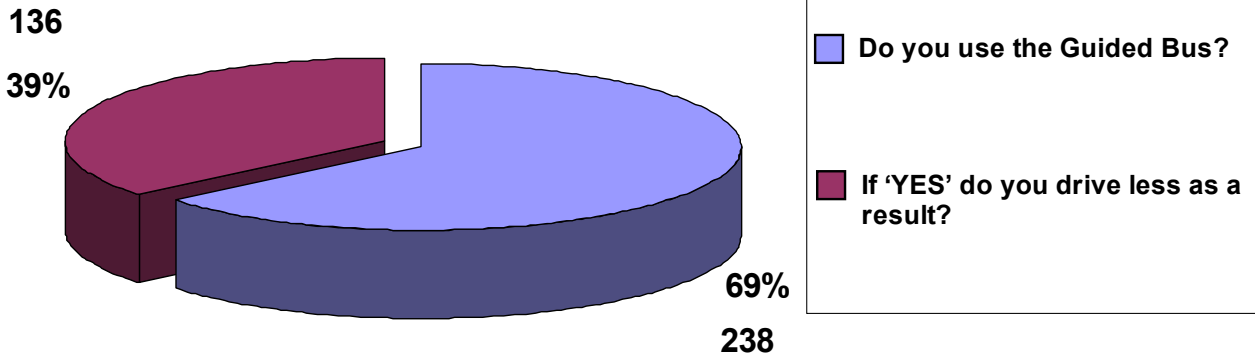

% of 344 total Respondants



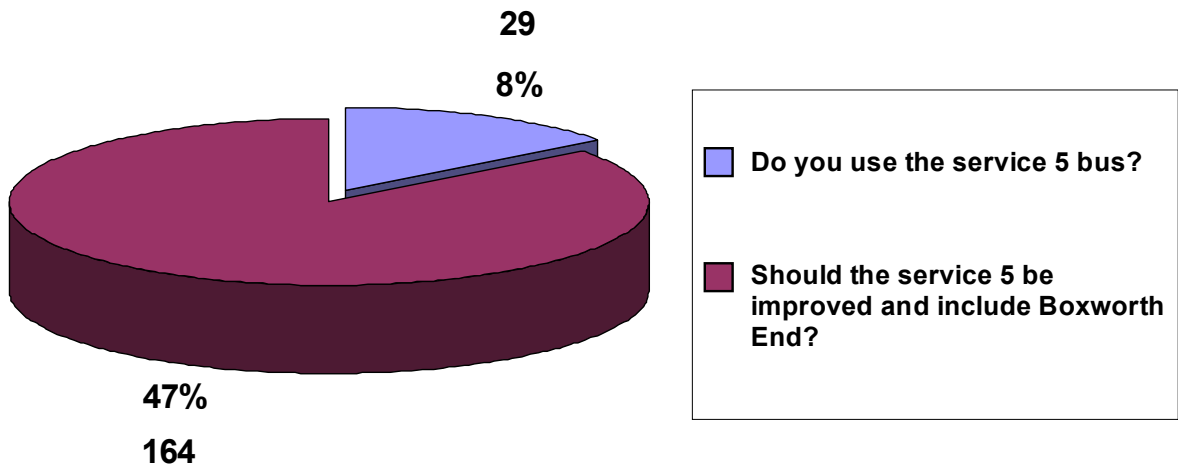

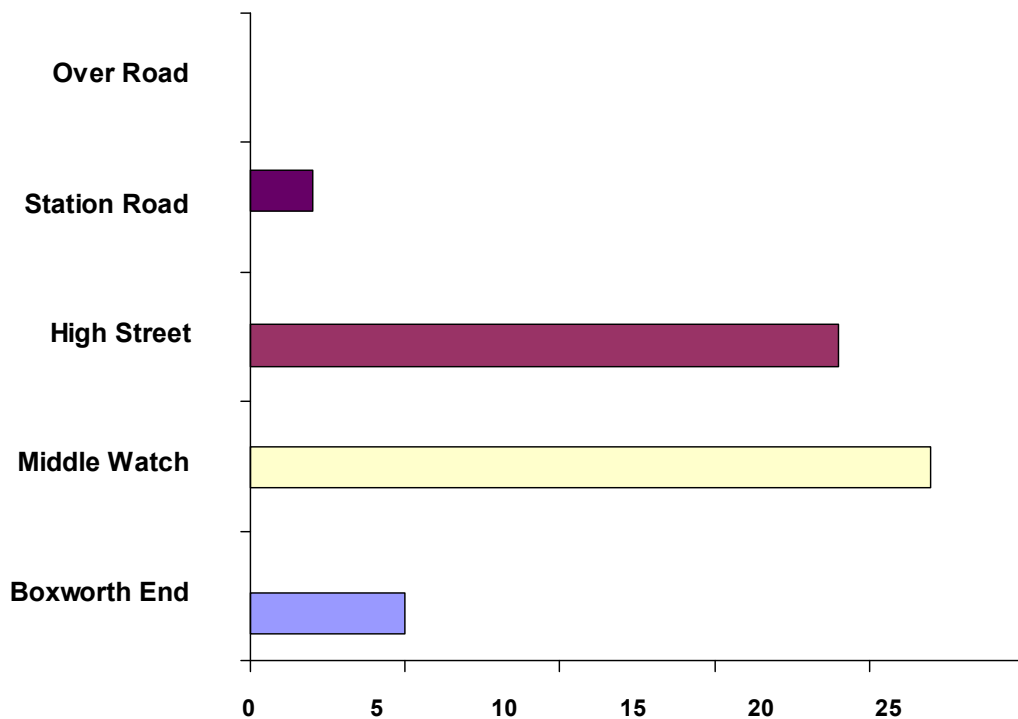

Q5: Where do you catch the service 5 bus?



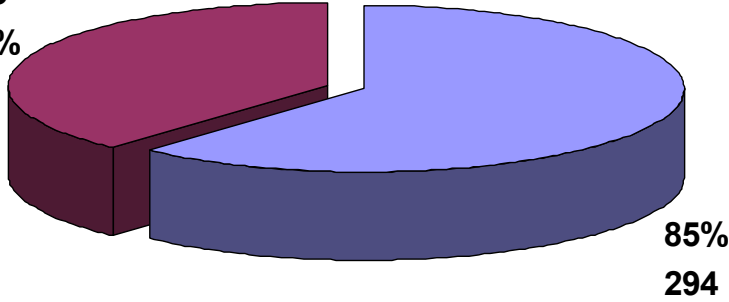

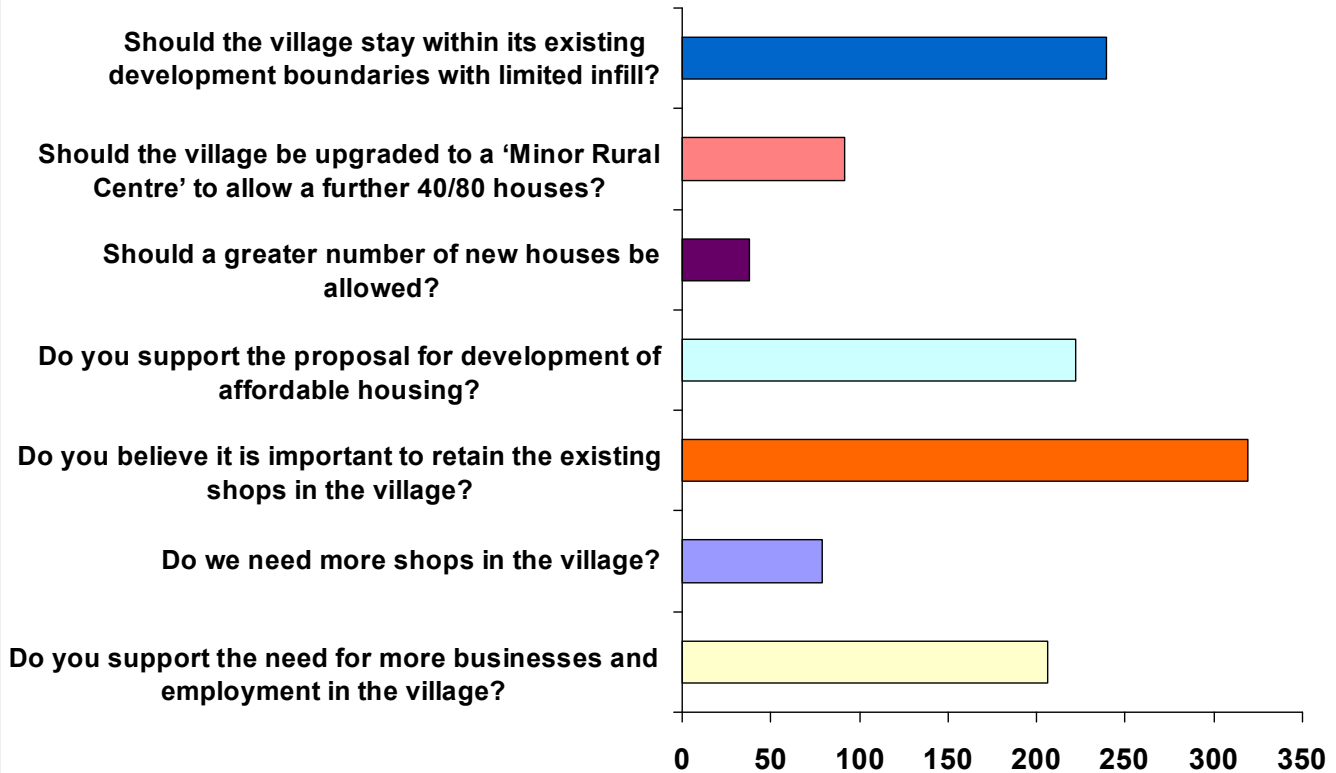

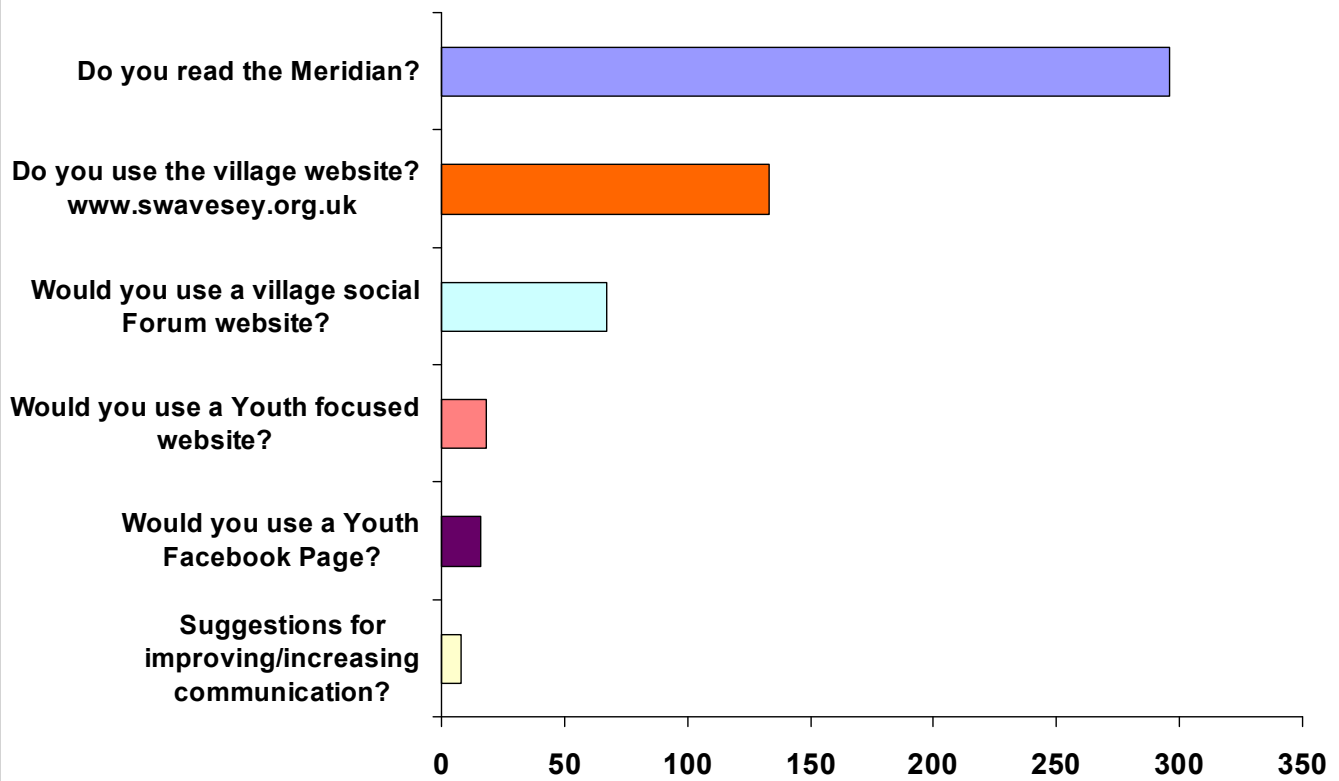

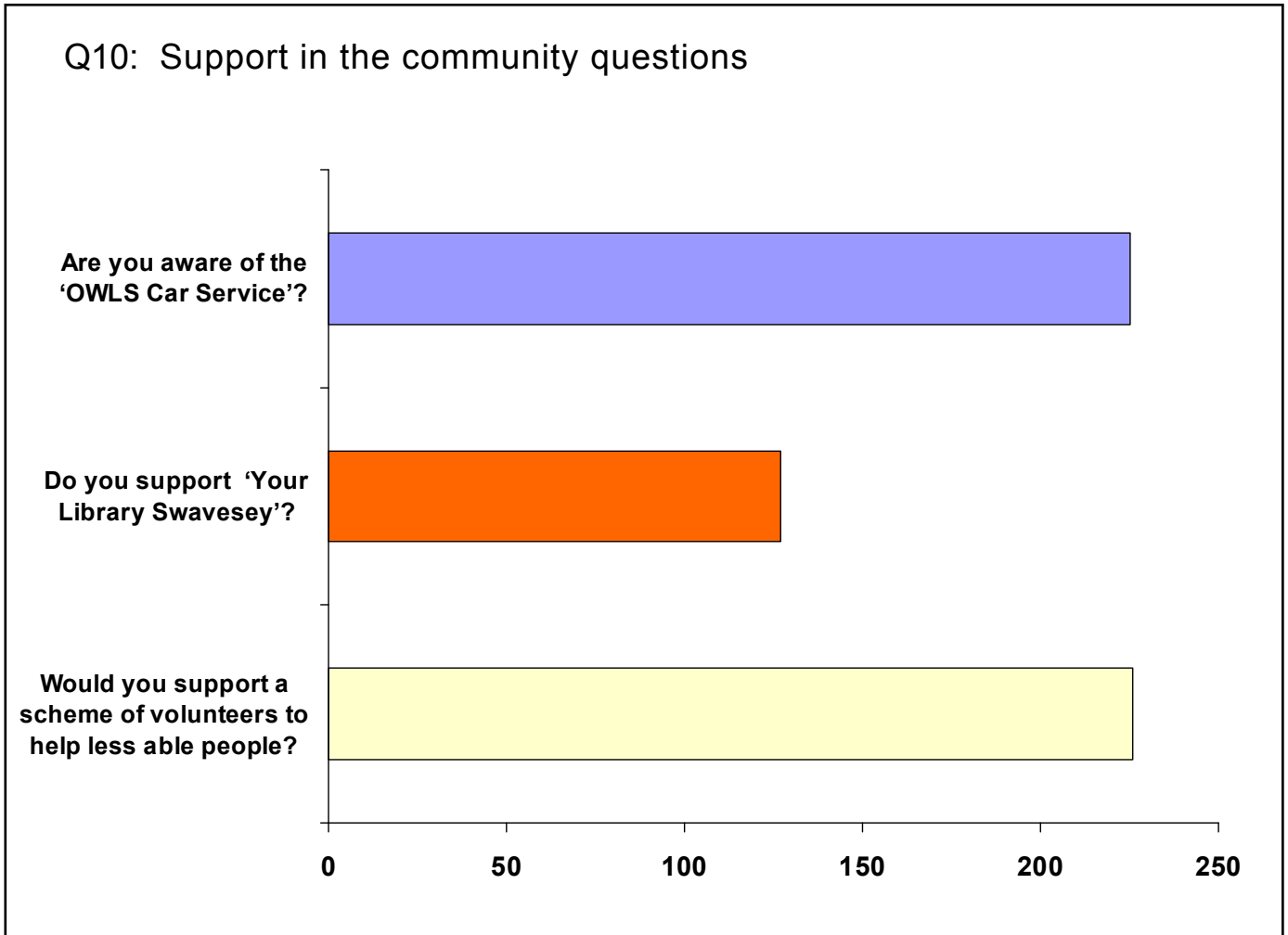

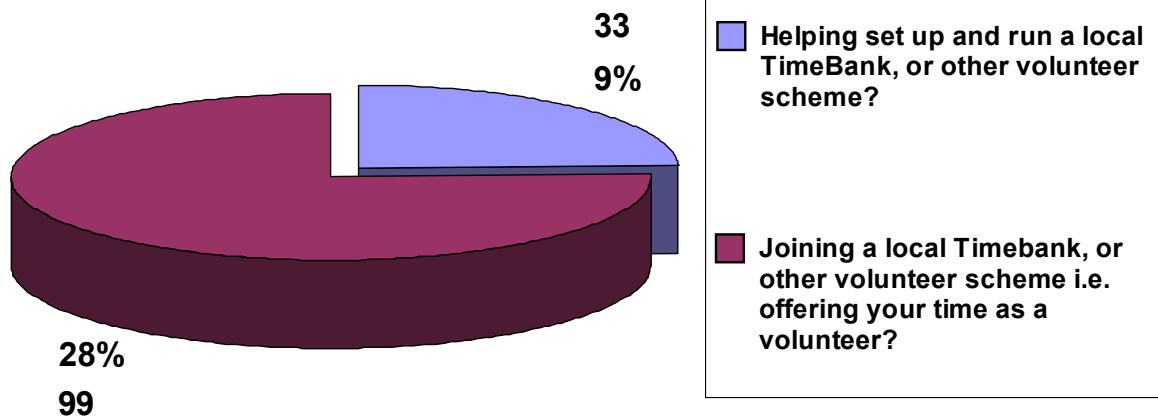

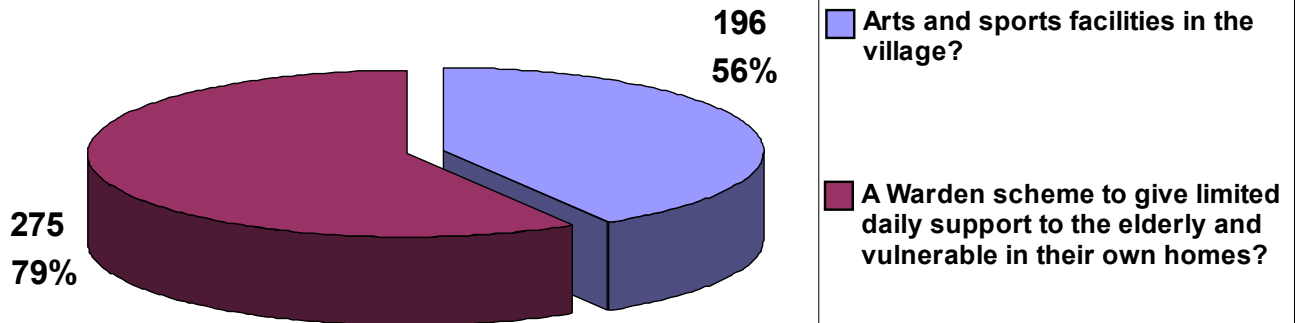

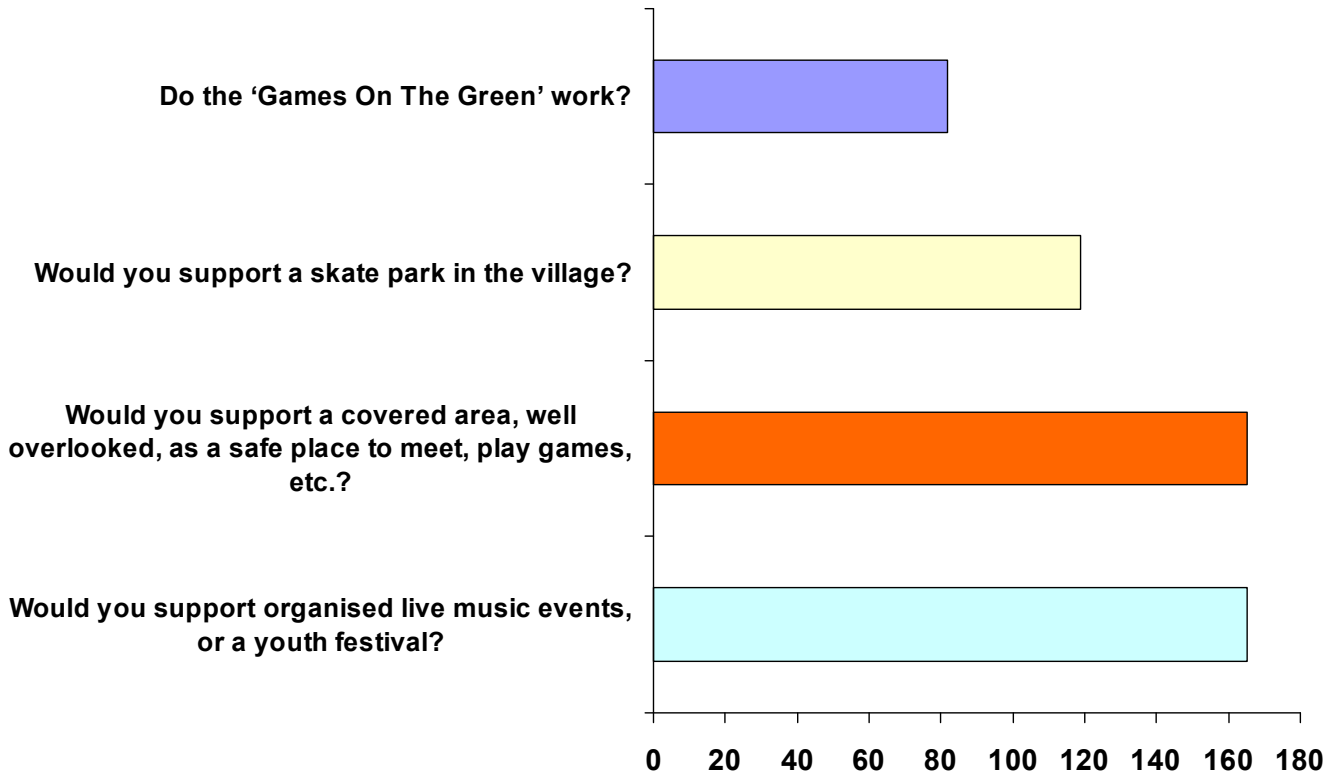

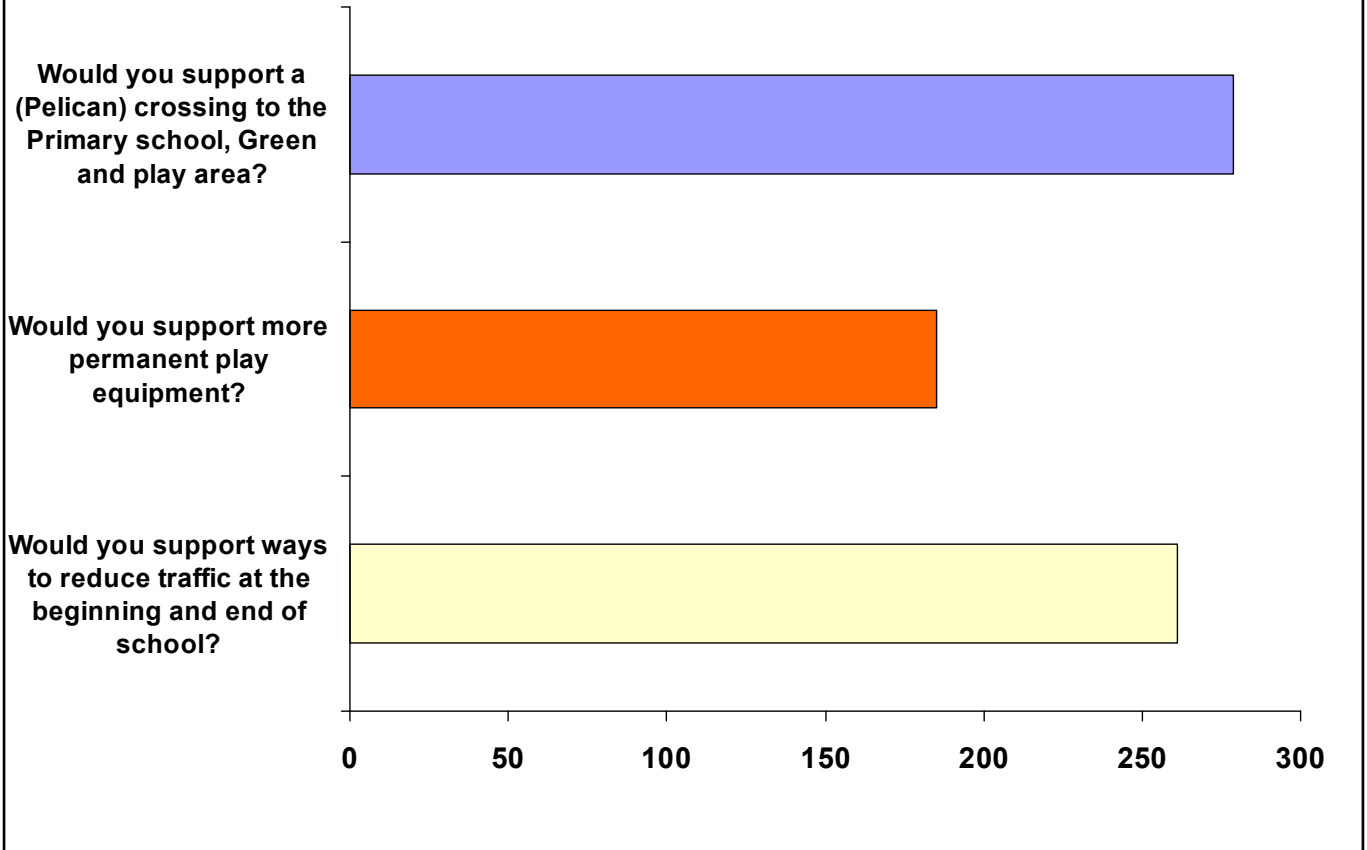

Q16: The primary school council came up with many ideas which are included in this questionnaire.



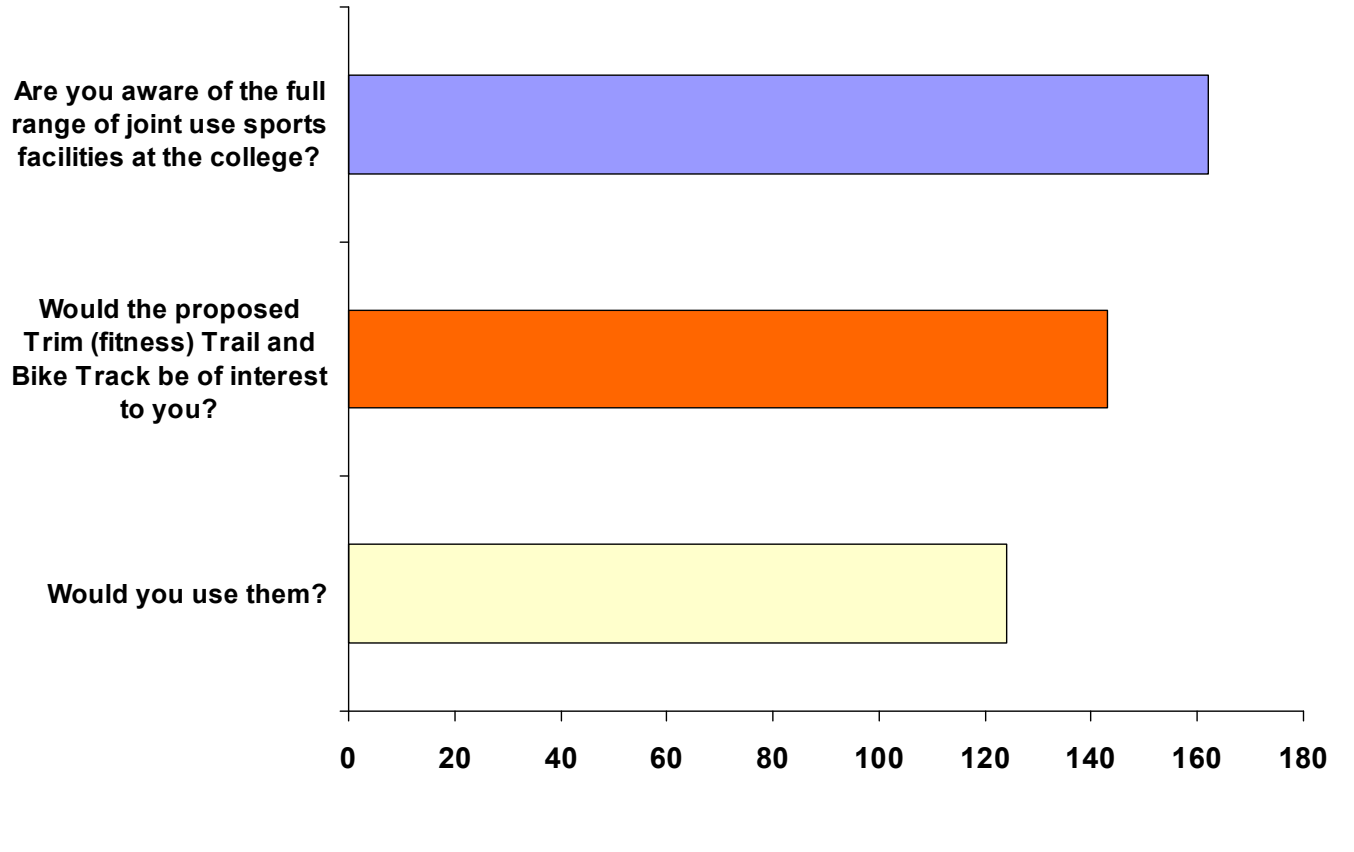

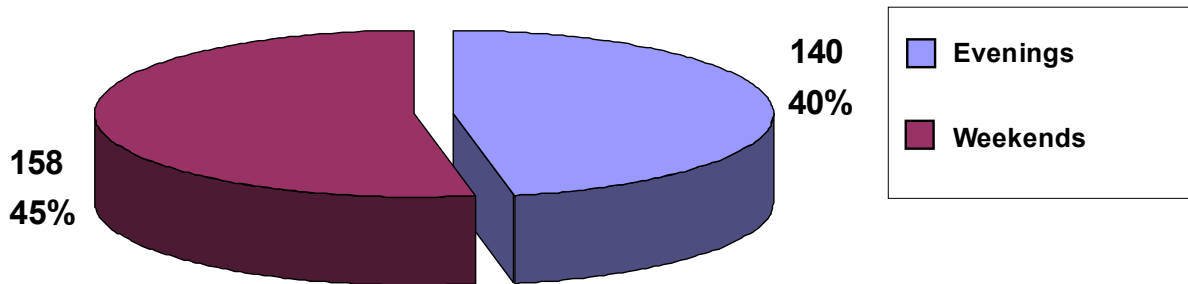

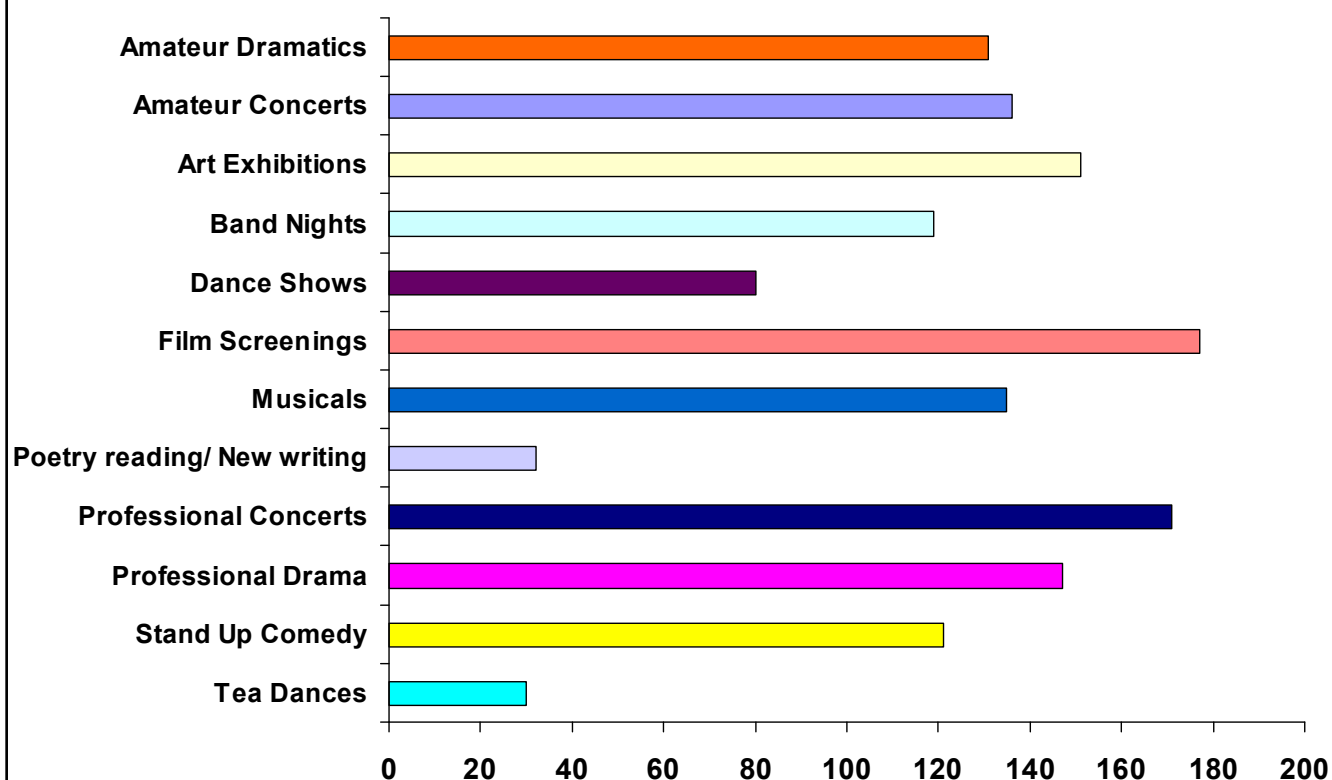

Q19: Swavesey Village College has a new Venue for community arts and performance events. What

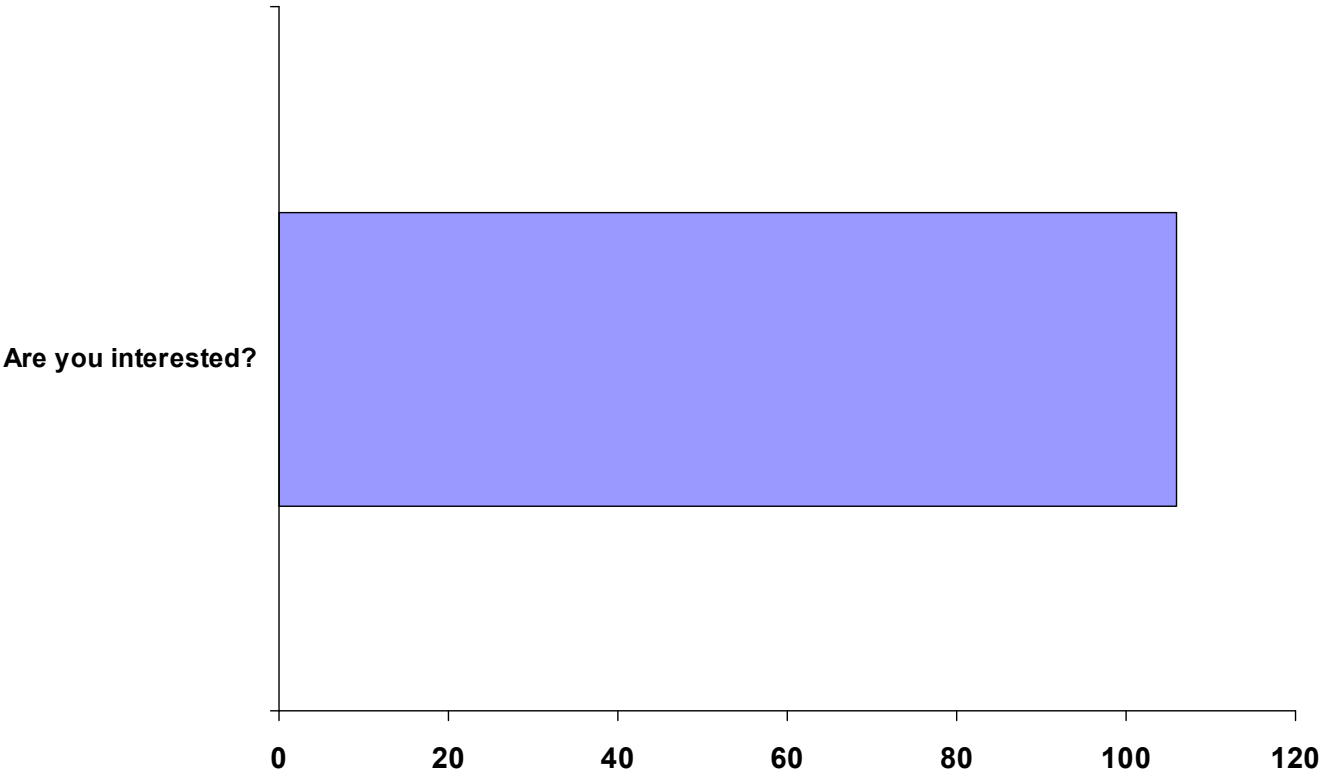

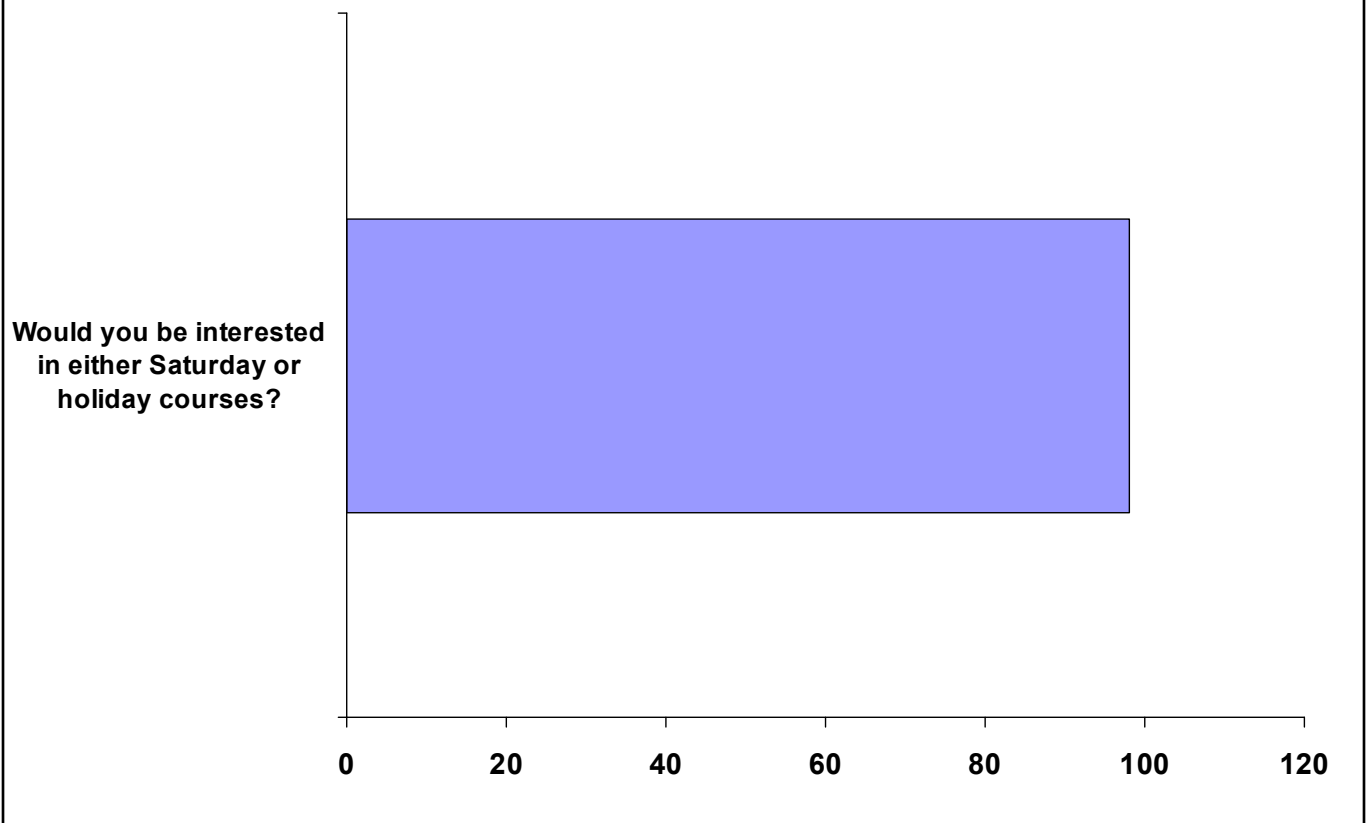

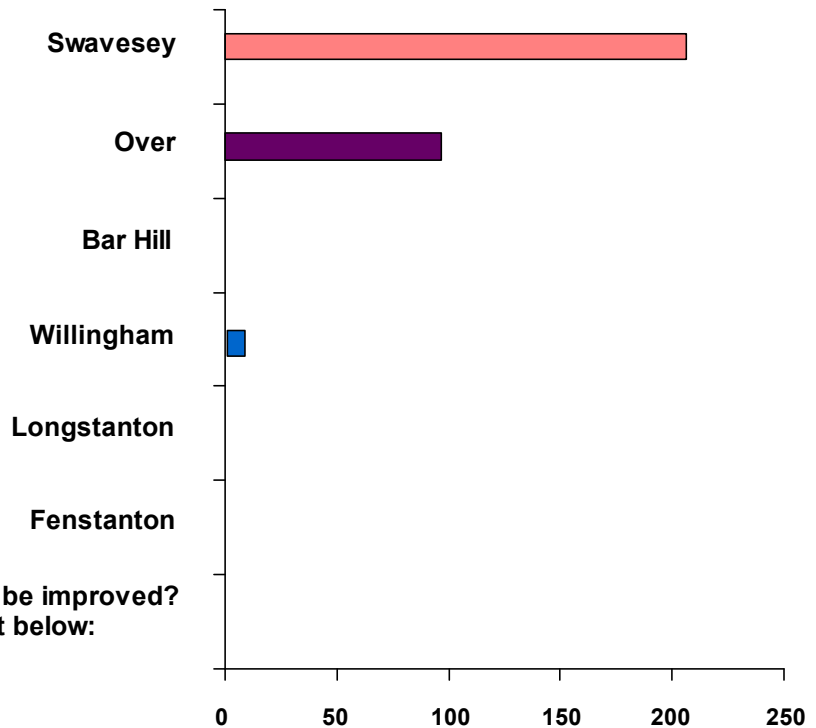

Q25: Do you know how to access the services available at the GP Surgery you are registered at?



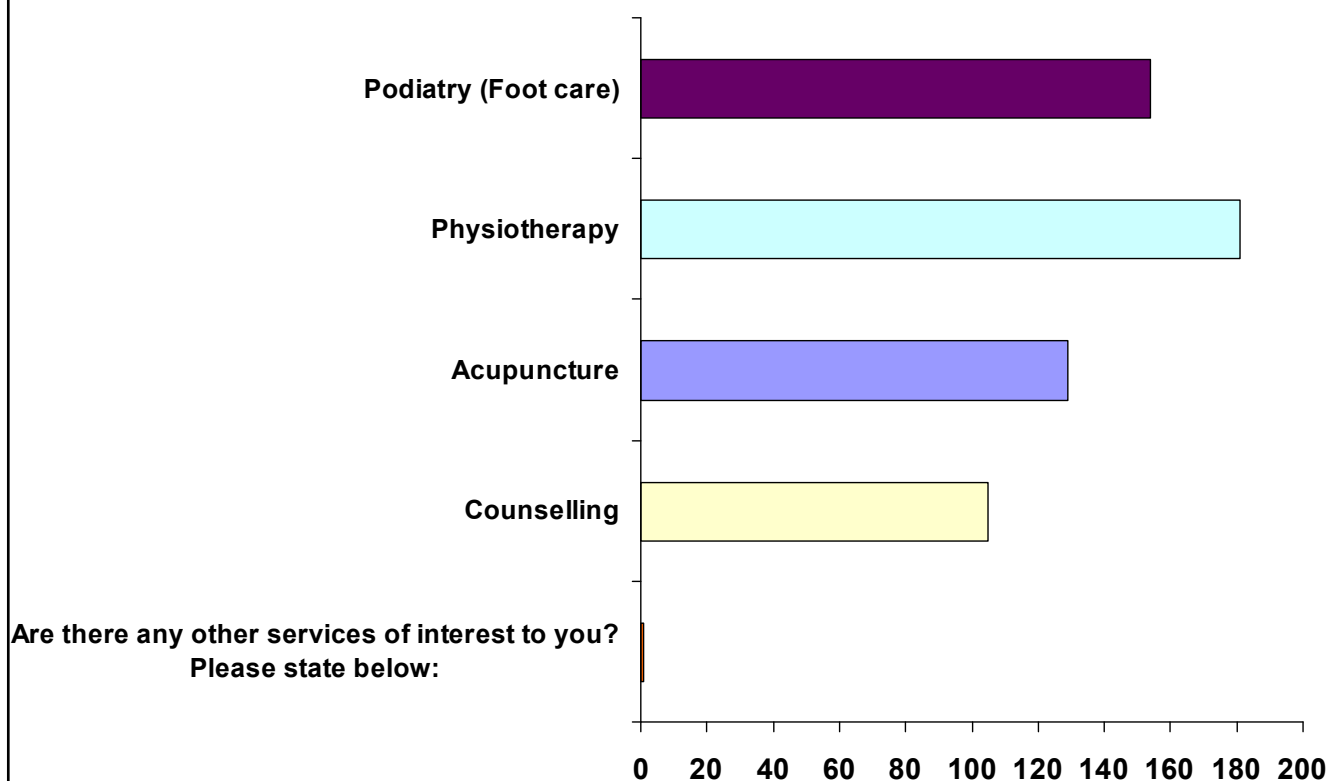

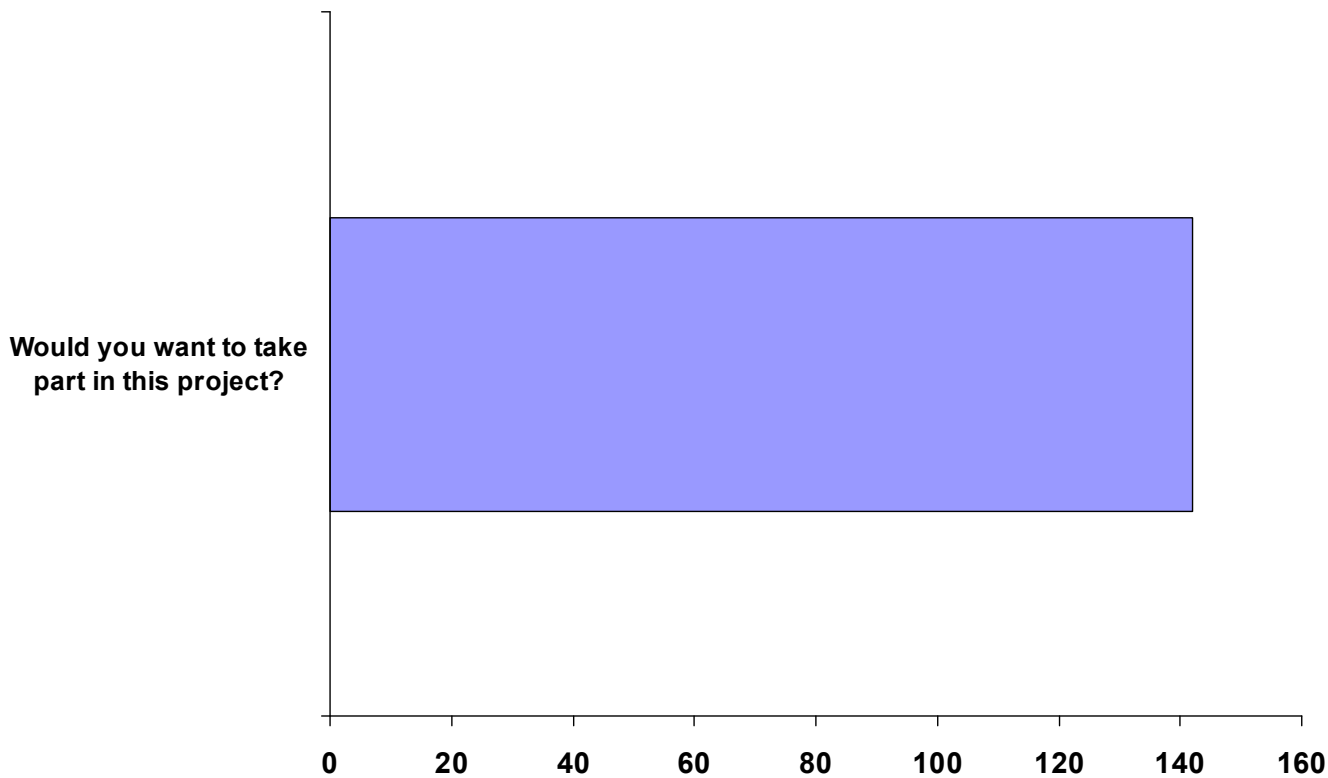

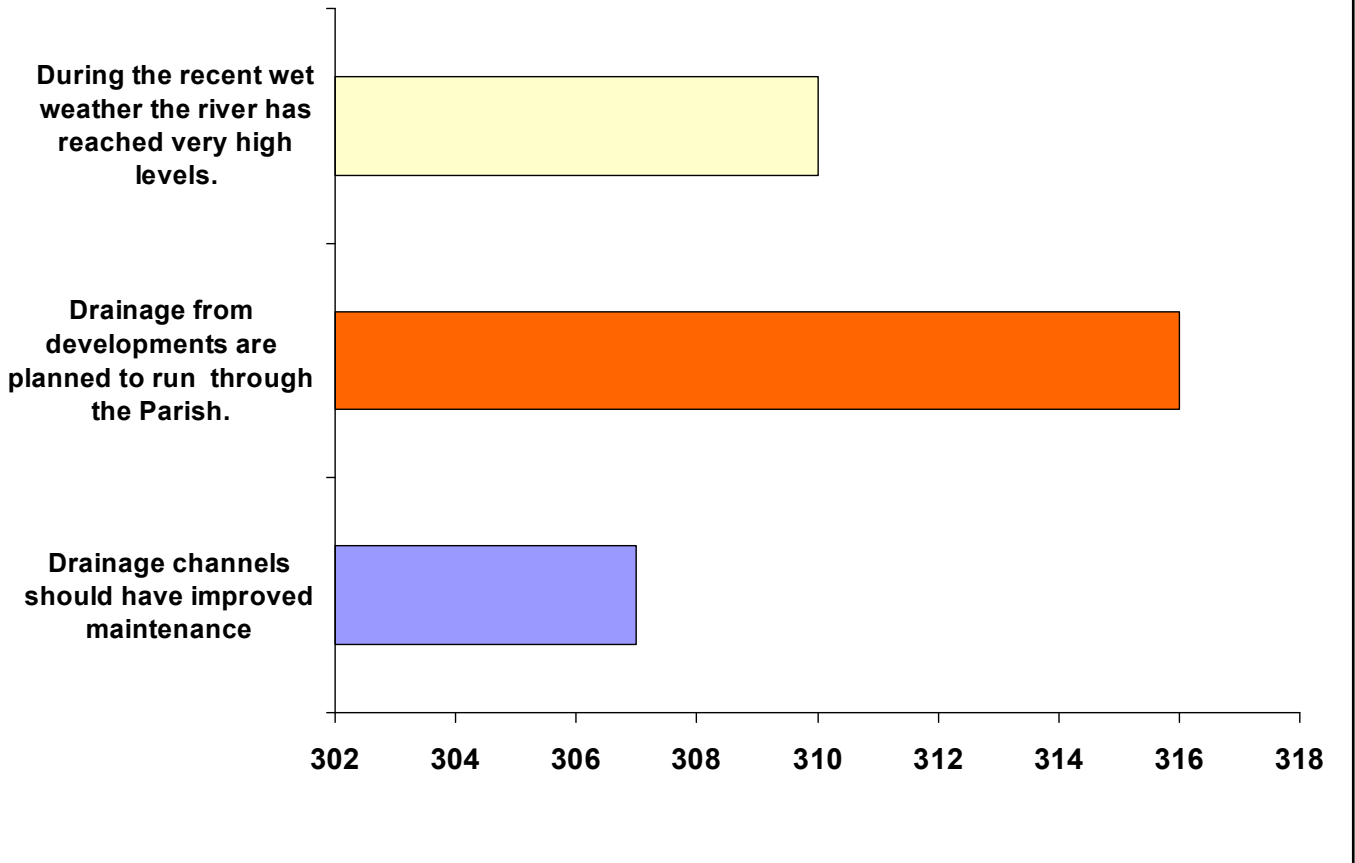
